Part 1**Outdoor Fires****§7-101. Burning of Material Causing Noxious Odors Prohibited.**

It shall be unlawful for any person to burn upon any premises in the Borough any garbage or material or substance causing any noxious or offensive odor.

§7-102. Fires on Streets, Alleys and Sidewalks Prohibited.

It shall be unlawful for any person to set or maintain any fire upon any street, gutter, alley or sidewalk in the Borough.

§7-103. Burning Prohibited.

It shall be unlawful for any persons to set or maintain any outdoor fire, anywhere in the Borough, at any time, except as set forth hereinafter. Outdoor cooking and recreational fires are exempted from this provision when contained in metal or masonry receptacles, and attended by an adult. Permitted outdoor cooking and recreational fires shall burn only wood, natural gas, propane or charcoal.

§7-104 Certain Conditions Imposed.

Recreational and cooking fires shall be subject to the following conditions:

A. No fire shall be permitted to burn unattended or to smoulder.

B. Burners shall be covered by a screen or grating.

C. Debris and residue associated with outdoor burning shall be removed from the area of the fire; shall not be allowed to become a nuisance to neighboring properties nor attractive to rodents.

§7-105. Penalty for Violation.

Any person, firm or corporation who shall violate any provision of this Part, upon conviction thereof, shall be sentenced to a fine of not more than \$1,000 plus costs and, in default of payment of said fine and costs, to a term of imprisonment not to exceed 30 days. Each day that a violation of this Part continues or each Section of this Part which shall be found to have been violated shall constitute a separate offense.
