## Recycle These Items:



### Aluminum Cans

Please empty and rinse cans if necessary. Crushing is optional but saves space.



### Glass Bottles and Jars

Separate bottles and jars by color; clear, brown and green. Remove all lids and rings. Rinse well, labels can remain.



### Newspapers

Keep dry. Inserts can remain. Keep separate from other papers. Do not bundle or tie.



### Steel or "Tin" Cans

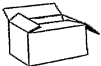
Rinse your cans and secure the lid(s) inside. Labels can remain.



### #1 and #2 Plastic Bottles & Jugs

Must be a "bottle or jug" with the neck smaller than the base. Includes soda and water bottles, ketchup bottles, milk and laundry detergent jugs, hygiene product bottles, etc. Remove the lid, empty and rinse well.

**NO** yogurt or butter containers, frozen dinner trays, baggies, toys, etc.



### Corrugated Cardboard

Flatten boxes and keep dry. Look for the ridges. No cereal/macaroni boxes.



### Mixed Paper/Junk Mail

Keep dry and separate from other paper. Includes envelopes, phone books, office paper.



### Magazines

Magazines and catalogs only. Keep separate from other types of paper. Do not bundle or tie. Keep dry.

## Source Separation is Key

By keeping your materials separated into the proper categories you have begun to process the materials for market to recycling manufacturers.

Separate the items listed by placing in a bin, paper or plastic bag. Items not correctly prepared will not be accepted.

## Buy Recycled Products

Materials recycled through the Northern Tier Solid Waste Authority are sold to manufacturers who make new products from them. Aluminum cans are 100% recyclable into more cans. Glass bottles are generally made into more bottles or jars. "Tin" or steel cans are sent to steel mills where they are processed into many steel products. Cardboard can be made into drywall paper backing. Magazines can be made into tissue products like napkins and toilet paper. #1 plastic bottles are made into new carpeting. These are only a few the examples of products that consumers should buy after they have been recycled.

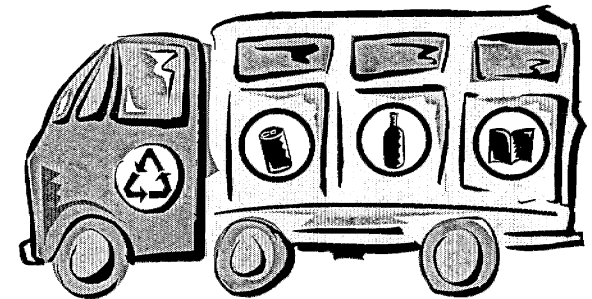

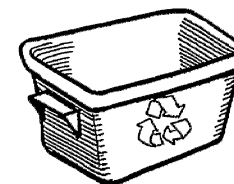
